Regional Leadership Event Promotes Collaboration

Fort Collins, Greeley, Loveland and Windsor (April 8, 2016) – The Mayors, Mayors Pro Tem and City Managers from the City of Fort Collins, the City of Greeley, the City of Loveland and the Town of Windsor are gathering for a regional discussion at the Budweiser Event Center Ranch Bar & Grill on Wednesday, May 11th.

This event is the result of an initial community gathering with the ultimate goal to create an aspirational process for regionalism. Elected officials and executive staff from each of the community's key departments have been invited in an effort to develop relationships and encourage communication across the region. Over time, the group's vision is to bring more communities and their elected and appointed officials into the conversation.

At the May 11 event, each Mayor will make brief comments about their desire to invest in and grow relationships between municipal elected and appointed officials and summarize the work done by their community to date for this effort. The Mayor's comments will be followed by a keynote presentation by Dr. Tim Elmore, a leading authority on developing emerging leaders and Relational Excellence. Dr. Elmore has been working closely with the City of Greeley and the Achieving Community Excellence (ACE) board sharing his inspirational messages and new opportunities for the community.

The Community Foundation of Northern Colorado and the Community Foundation Serving Greeley and Weld County are in support of the regional discussion and have assumed the role of facilitator and convener.
